


Bilingual community input in October 2022 included:

- Task Force Info. Session & Community Leader Input
- 637 surveys (incl. 120 teachers-staff + 54 Spanish)



Phase 2 Community Input Confirmed Original 5 Areas of Focus Remain Relevant + New Ideas



Review of Phase 2 input collected from community and Task Force confirm TTUSD still considers these five areas key priorities for the future, and also **value**:

- Reconnecting following pandemic disruptions
- Local resources & local area (sense of place)



These five "buckets" provided organizing structure for Task Force Team Research Reports completed in May.


Task Force Reports for Board Review May 2023
