

Educational Specialist

Purpose Statement

The Educational Specialist is to assist in the implementation of curriculum, instruction, and professional learning. The Educational Specialist also supports the development, implementation, and monitoring of a comprehensive student data and assessment system that connects assessment to instruction and facilitates the use of assessment results to improve instruction and intervention.

Essential Functions

- Build and sustain relationships with the district and school staff

- Supports the Educational Service Department in the monitoring and ongoing implementation of the TTUSD Strategic Plan
- Coordinates and implements comprehensive professional development programs that align with the TTUSD Strategic Plan. These programs will be designed to support teachers in adapting their instructional practices by understanding critical pedagogy, evidence-based instructional research, and the necessity for evolving their teaching methods in response to student performance data and learning needs.
- Assists the Curriculum, Instruction, and Assessment Coordinator in reviewing instructional materials.
 - Supports in the coordination of instructional materials adoption with curriculum training
- Provides support in implementing and monitoring a comprehensive student assessment system
 - Supports Curriculum, Instruction, and Assessment Coordinator in the coordination of state and local assessments
 - Supports the continued development of MTSS (Tier One and Tier Two) districtwide
 - Collaboratively troubleshoot issues with the district student data system with other district staff and departments as needed
 - Engage in ongoing professional growth to increase knowledge of and proficiency in the use of the district student data system
 - Attend meetings as necessary for the development of district assessments
- Use improvement science methods and current research to facilitate and support the use of assessment results to improve instruction and intervention
 - Support administrators and school staff in
 - continuous improvement cycles (PDSAs)
 - utilizing the district student data system
 - analysis of data to support student learning and instruction
- Engage in ongoing professional growth to stay current with the research related to assessment, intervention, MTSS, teaching, and learning
- Other job-related duties
 - composing a variety of documents
 - collecting, tabulating, and evaluating data
 - preparing and maintaining informational reports
- Other related duties as assigned
