Why the Tahoe City Dog Park?

Location

central to bus transit, bike path, walkable from elementary school, close to amenities, visible to public, near other active public recreation, existing bathroom and parking, accessible to multiple communities

Buildable land for Skatepark

flat, rectangular shape, good size for park, not a lot of existing trees to remove

We have Been Searching for Two Years

Analyzed in detail numerous potential parcels

No other parcel determined to be both feasible and able to meet all (or even most) of the requirements for successful skatepark



Reason Other Sites Are Not Viable For A Skatepark

401 West Lake Blvd

- site not visible from street
- no public restoom
- significant slope

Hertiage Plaza

- too small
- no parking, no restrooms
- requires moving significant infrastructure
- site had recent improvements and SLF did not want to remove

Firestone Property

- Deed restriction, so unable to build
- requires significant tree removal
- no restrooms
- minimal supervision from other park users until further developed
