## SB 114 Mid Year Requirement

Section	Key Requirement
<b>SB 114, Sec 42</b> EC 47606.5	Charter "mid-year" report to the board on or before February 28 of each year.
<b>SB 114, Sec 61</b> EC 52062	<b>District</b> "mid-year" report to the board on or before February 28 of each year.
<b>SB 114, Sec 68</b> EC 52068	<b>COE</b> "mid-year" report to the board on or before February 28 of each year.

#### Section 61 of Education Code 52062, as Amended by SB 114

- (6) (A) The superintendent of the school district shall present a report on the annual update to the local control and accountability plan and the local control funding formula budget overview for parents on or before February 28 of each year at a regularly scheduled meeting of the governing board of the school district.
- (B) The report shall include both of the following:
- (i) All available midyear outcome data related to metrics identified in the current year's local control and accountability plan.
- (ii) All available midgear expenditure and implementation data on all actions identified in the current year's local control and accountability plan.

# What does "All available" data mean for the LCAP mid-year report?

- No specifics in statute.
- Allows flexibility for the LEAs.

## Board Presentation Requirements

Senate Bill 114 requires LEA's to present an update on the 2023–2024 LCAP and budget overview for parents on or before February 28, 2024, at a regularly scheduled meeting of the governing board or body of the LEA. At this meeting the LEA must include all of the following:

- All available mid-year outcome data (LCAP Metrics).
- All available mid-year implementation data (LCAP Actions).
- All available mid-year expenditure data (LCAP Expenditures).

## Metric Outcome Examples

#### Unknown:

Metrics aligned to Local Indicators might not be known because 2023-24 updates might not have been started/completed.

#### In Progress:

Some LCAP Metric outcomes will be in progress: Attendance Rates, Chronic Absenteeism Rates , Local Assessment Results

#### Known:

Appropriately Assigned Teachers, Access to Instructional Materials, Spring 2023 CA Dashboard Data, FIT reports, since they are due for SARC reporting

## Expenditure Outcome Examples

#### Not Started:

Some LCAP Actions may not have been implemented or not started: *For example...* Due to staffing shortages/vacancies, some services may not have started, Shifting priorities at the beginning of the school year, Planned professional development (PD) may be delayed due to sub shortages.

#### In Progress:

Some LCAP Actions will be in progress: *For example...* Planned PD may have started, but not all staff has had the opportunity to participate, Some staff may have been hired for a particular program, but recruitment is continuing.

#### Completed:

Some LCAP Actions will be complete: *For example...* Materials (i.e. software, technology, supplies, etc.) have been purchased, Recruitment has been completed/positions filled. Training/PD has been completed.
