12. Please describe your activities and involvement on your local board, community, and/or CSBA. *

I have advocated individually and in collaboration with other elected officials to improve education and to help Roseville and Placer County schools lead in California. I have also formed an education non-profit which advocates for better education policies. I have testified for or against several bills relating to education and families and have written several position papers on education related bills and policies. I am the co-author of the Protect Kids of California Act from last year that received over 400,000 signatures.

13. What do you see as the biggest challenge facing governing boards and how can CSBA help address it? *

CSBA has become politically biased in a way that favors San Francisco values over the values of our region. For example, last year CSBA opposed AB 3216 under the pretense it hinders local control, and at the same time, refused to oppose AB 1955 which does exactly that and worse.

Furthermore, CSBA has been known to push policies to member districts that misrepresent the law and, in some cases, even violate the law. This is seemingly to get these unpalatable policies in California schools without having to involve the legislature.

My goal in becoming a CSBA delegate is to stop CSBA policies and positions from undermining our local values and hopefully get positions they take to align with the values of our region.
