#### District-Wide Grants - \$13,870

#### TTUSD HeartMath Expansion- Kim Bradley

Grant funds expansion of the HeartMath program in eight TTUSD schools. <u>HeartMath</u> is a stress management system that helps students synchronize their brain and heart rate for optimal stress resistance and mental performance.

Fully Fund \$5,140

Enhancement of Early Learning materials to promote diversity, multicultural, and inclusivity- Cindy Maciel This grant provides materials and equipment for TTUSD's early learning programs - Sierra Teen Education Parenting Program (STEPP) and the Truckee State Preschool program. This grant funds a variety of materials such as dolls, dress-up materials, books, visual aids, art materials, and equipment that supports the diversity of our families, community, and the abilities of all of our students.

Fully Fund \$4,730

# Materials for the Accelerated Learning/GATE Classroom - Ashley Donahue

Grant funds accelerated learning/GATE classroom materials at Truckee Elementary and Glenshire Elementary schools. This grant will provide the tools and materials to develop and implement innovative curricula for gifted learners, creative thinkers, and high achievers.

# Reading Comprehension - Erica Stukey Allstadt

This grant funds novel sets for the  $4^{th}/5^{th}$ -grade classroom teacher and for the  $2^{nd}/3^{rd}$  grade that address topics in diversity. The individual books requested are the ones commonly requested by students. *Fully Fund* \$1,690

#### PE Expansion: Baseball Gloves and Climbing Wall Holds—Holly Williamson

Grant funds a variety of sports equipment: baseball Gloves, balls, and climbing wall holds. This grant will help to expand offerings for baseball and a more challenging climbing wall with accessories for creative traversing. Fully Fund \$1,948

# Technology and STEM- Erica Stukey Allstad

Grant funds an extension of Science and Technology with the purchase of the Lego Robotics Program as well as Ozobot Evo Robots that students can code and watch their work in action. This grant allows the extension of learning in science, technology, and engineering.

Grant funds a series of standards-based mathematics games that apply to multiple grade levels and academic needs.

Grant funds one set of The DBQ Project Mini-Qs in US History Volumes and Spanish Versions. DBQ units provide a scaffolded and accessible opportunity for all students to build analytical thinking and writing through historical lenses in Spanish.

# History-Social Science Content Standard books - Amy Meierotto

Grant funds for grade-level books specific to the Spanish missions in California. These books help students learn about the social, political, cultural, and economic life and interactions among people of California from the pre-Columbian societies to the Spanish mission and Mexican rancho periods. *Fully Fund \$1,459*

Grant funds experiential fun books that focus on growth mindset, compassion, and character strengths. Being able to hold, play and interact with the material is instrumental in learning. Fully fund \$256

# <u>High Level - Age Appropriate Library Books and Literature Circle Book Sets for Advanced Readers – Teresa Ketron</u>

Grant funds individual books for student checkout and literature circle books set for group reading. These additional books expand choices for *students* reading at a higher level. *Fully Fund \$2,000* 

#### Sensory Bin Filler and Kits at Glenshire Elementary - Taylor Strong

Grant funds a sensory table, multi-function bins, scented sensory fillers, and hand tools. This grant supports all three kindergarten classes. These items will enhance character development, imaginative play, speaking and listening skills, fine and gross motor skills, conflict solution, independent exploration, and application of learning.

# DBQ Project - Document Based Mini Lessons for 6th grade Social Studies - Nicole Sayegh

Grant funds The DBQ Mini-Qs in World History that will engage students with 11 Essential Questions related to the 6th Grade Social Studies Ancient Civilization Curriculum. Students will have an opportunity to analyze informational text, synthesize information from various sources, identify/evaluate the author's point of view, and support claims with evidence in writing.

#### Sports Medicine Classroom Essentials – Hana Lamb

Grant funds knee and ankle sports injury trainers for students as well as a new sports medicine bench for students to practice evaluating, treating, and assessing injuries. Students will learn through practical hands-on application how to assess, prepare, prevent, evaluate, and treat emergency procedures. *Fully Fund \$4,660* 

# Vlogging and Journalism tech/Podcasting—Erin LeFevers/Annie Stefani

Grant increases opportunities for students to experience "real world"/21<sup>st</sup>-century writing and presentation. Students will be able to write journalistic-like articles and create podcasts that can be posted online and for classroom presentations.

#### Music Equipment for North Tahoe High School Band - Todd Holway

Grant funds instrument cases to protect tubas as well as quality amplifiers for the Jazz Band rhythm section. New tuba cases will extend the life of the instruments by decades by allowing them to be properly protected and stored.

Fully Fund \$1,748 (TTUSD can match using the Musical Instrument Fund – total request was \$3,496)

Grant funds for additional ceramic storage cabinets for the classroom. These functional cabinets would preserve clay and store ceramic materials. We are funding one of the two cabinets requested at this time. Partially Fund \$3,860 of \$7,708

#### River Ecology and Marine Biology Applied Learning – Caroline Dezendorf

Grant funds dissection and lab materials that are critical components of the science courses as they provide hands-on learning opportunities. Students will be able to connect with aquatic ecosystems and this grant will bolster the curriculum by providing resources that will allow students to better engage with aquatic ecosystems.

# <u>Curriculum Enhancement for Biomedical Science Courses – Kathy Tallant</u>

Grant funds updated equipment to expand the biomedical course. The request includes equipment for additional hands-on activities and labs to enhance the course curriculum. The Human Body Systems course curriculum is being updated for the 2023-2024 school year and materials are needed to align with future careers.

#### RealCare Babies - Courtney Delgado

Grant funds eight "RealCare 3 Babies," charging cart, workbooks, curriculum, and online training. This grant is for a unit in the "Adulting Course." It helps students realize the impact of parenting and promotes waiting until they are emotionally, financially, psychologically, and socially ready to take on the heavy demands; and second, to introduce the importance and variety of skills needed in caring for an infant. Grant funds ten digital book sets of Decodable Readers for small-group reading instruction. The emphasis on teaching students to read via decoding (sounding out) words has been proven to be more efficient and more effective.

Fully Fund \$6,633

#### DRA Reading Assessment Materials-Lynn Akers

Grant funds for the update of outdated and incomplete DRA (Developmental Reading Assessment, 4-8) Kits. DRA is a classroom-based reading assessment designed for on-level and struggling 4th through 8th-grade students.

Fully Fund \$468

# Supplemental Subscriptions to Enhance Literacy in the Elementary Classroom- Diane Welch

Grant funds an increase in a variety of high-interest reading material to a classroom library. This allows students the flexibility to choose additional reading material that fosters a love of reading. *Fully Fund \$486* 

#### Second and Third Grade Classroom Library Revamp- Diane Welch

Grant funds the update and revamp of the second and third-grade classroom library to be more inviting to young readers. This grant will encourage students to choose fiction books that interest them, become more excited to read popular characters or deepen their knowledge of non-fiction titles that spark further curiosity. *Fully Fund \$994* 

# 3rd grade Mystery Science Kits - Diane Welch

Grant funds kits that provide science lessons in class. Each pack contains supplies for 30 students working together in groups and/or with partners. These kits engage students in NGSS-aligned science lessons. *Fully Fund \$466* 

# Spring 2023 Grants – Not Funded

#### STAS Papergrip Picture Hanging Mounts – Rita Ramirez

Grant funds a picture-hanging rail system that can be installed and enjoyed for many years. This picture-hanging system allows artwork to be displayed and projects can foster a sense of accomplishment, pride, and creativity in students.

The grant request was for \$3,968

- The committee hoped that the school's PTO might be able to fund this request.

# Graphing Calculators for High School Success - Sara Gooding

Grant funds 310 new graphing calculators which students will have continuous access to a graphing calculator during all four years of high school, providing greater success in math, science, and CTE courses and on college entrance exams. The request is so the high school could issue a graphing calculator to freshmen when they start high school, similar to the issuing of Chromebooks.

The grant request was for \$41,949

- The committee was concerned that the calculators would get lost during the four-year period.

Students are issued graphing calculators when they are enrolled in a math course that requires one.

Our concern is that when a student doesn't have math, the calculator may get lost. Additionally, almost everyone has access to a basic calculator with their phone. Based on our understanding, there are enough calculators for students who need one while taking a math course.

#### Fly Fishing: An Interpretive and Historical Experience—Jennifer Jurosky

Grant funds the opportunity for students to have a chance to engage in a sport that is life-changing in the context of history spoken by the Paiute. This grant includes a partnership with the Cast Hope organization.

The grant request was for \$4,076

- The committee felt this request is an Extracurricular Club, therefore, doesn't meet our grant cycle criteria. However, through the support of a connection to the Rohr Family Foundation, we were able to fund this grant. The Rohr Foundation donated \$4,500 to Excellence in Education to fund this request. We will treat it as a pass-through grant.
