Community Interpreter/Translator/Liaison

Purpose Statement

The Community Interpreter/Translator/Liaison plays a pivotal role in fostering effective communication and building strong relationships between schools and its diverse community. This position combines the responsibilities of a traditional School Community Liaison with the specialized skills of a Community Interpreter/Translator. The ideal candidate will be a skilled interpreter/translator and communicator, culturally competent, and committed to promoting inclusivity and student success through Language Access.

Essential Functions

Community Engagement and Support

- Develop positive relationships with students, parents, community organizations, local businesses, and other stakeholders.
- Act as a liaison between schools and the community, ensuring effective communication and information sharing.
- Provide support and resources to parents and guardians, helping them navigate the school system and support their children's education.
- When students are identified as facing academic, behavioral, or social challenges, collaborate with teachers, counselors, and families to develop intervention plans and connect them to community support
- Advocate for the needs of students and families within the school system and help address any language barriers to student achievement.
- Collect and analyze data related to community engagement to inform decision-making and identify areas for improvement.
- Assist in developing and implementing programs that enhance community engagement and student well-being.

Language Access

On-Site and Virtual Interpretation/Translations Services:

- Provide on-site interpretation during meetings, parent-teacher conferences, school events, and other relevant activities.
- Offer virtual interpretation services for remote meetings, phone calls, and other virtual interactions.
- Accurately convey spoken communication between individuals who speak different languages while maintaining the tone and context of the original message.
- Translate written documents, such as announcements, newsletters, permission slips, and presentations, to ensure that multilingual parents and students can access important information.
- Maintain the accuracy and cultural sensitivity of translated materials.
- Adhere to a strict code of confidentiality, ensuring that all information shared during interpretation and translation remains private and secure.
- As identified in the TTUSD Language Access Plan, adhere to the National code of ethics AND Standards of practice for interpreters in education.

Language Support Programs:

- Collaborate with school staff to develop and implement language support programs, such as bilingual education, English language learner (ELL) programs, and after-school tutoring.
- Identify and refer students who may benefit from additional language support services.
- Advocate for equitable access to language support resources for multilingual families.
- Support all departments in providing language access to our multilingual community.

Cultural Competence and Professionalism

- Demonstrate a deep understanding of the cultural nuances and sensitivities of the school's diverse community to ensure effective cross-cultural communication.
- Conduct oneself with professionalism and maintain a neutral stance during interpretation, avoiding personal opinions or biases that could affect the communication process.

Job Requirements & Skills

- A bachelor's degree in social work, counseling, community relations, linguistics, or a related field or three
 years of experience in related fields is preferred.
- Fluency in English and at least one other language (Spanish), with strong oral and written communication skills in both languages.
- Interpreter training and three years of experience in the field are preferred.
- Cultural sensitivity and awareness, with the ability to navigate and respect diverse cultural backgrounds.
- Interpersonal skills and the ability to build positive relationships with students, parents, teachers, and staff
 members.
- Organizational skills to manage scheduling and effectively prioritize assignments.
- Professionalism, punctuality, and reliability in fulfilling job responsibilities.
- Knowledge of educational terminology and practices is an advantage.
- Proficiency in using virtual interpretation platforms and software.
- Work as a team and work independently

Work Environment
